In the Spotlight

MID CENTURY MODERN

A descendant of the Art Deco period, Mid-century modern is the now popular term used to describe furniture and objects from roughly the 1930's through the 1960's. Lines are simple and clean, functionality is paramount, finishes are often light, and ornamentation is missing or streamlined. It is largely post war and newer: ultramodern, space-age, futuristic, radical or just plain unusual, quirky, unconventional, non-traditional or curiously different. Big names here include furniture manufacturers Heywood Wakefield and Knoll, and designers Nakashima, Eames, Eero Saarinen, and Russell Wright.

Remember Robert Indiana's LOVE poster? For many, it may have been in the same room with the Eames chair and the Danish Modern dining room suite set with Fiesta dinnerware while the Jetsons were on TV. For some visionaries, the era was represented by the Nakashima slab coffee table, the Bertoaia wire sculpture, a Mies van der Rohe "Barcelona" chair, all in the futuristic glass house. This generation of design has appreciated over the past couple of years and the best industrial, functional and vintage examples are in great demand in some marketplaces.
